July was a busy month for me, finished painting the airplane parts that were either modified or new with the exception of the gear legs which will have to wait until the motor is on and I put the cowling on so it will be easier to cover up during the painting process. Also, went to Oshkosh along with Seb and Darlene Trost, Robert and Kathleen Jones, Erich Trombley and my wife Sue. Weather was ok for the most part, if you consider hot and humid OK!

There were several interesting planes present one of which was made by Pipistrel. Here is a picture of it and they will be competing with other electric planes for \$1.65 million in the CAFÉ/NASA Green Flight Challenge held in Santa Rosa, CA.

Next on the list of interesting displays was the introduction of a new engine concept which is a twist on some proven technology that GM has used for years in their AC compressors. This engine is a four stroke engine with 5 pistons installed in cylinder block that also rotates in a housing where the cylinder block drives the crankshaft at 5 times the speed of the block. Did I lose you yet? On top of that the cylinder head (only one) has 3

of each, spark plugs, intakes and exhaust ports. Still with me? Put this altogether and you have an engine with low reciprocating part, high power density, quick throttle response and very smooth! Have I piqued your interest yet?

Now here is the best part, it is 1100 cc's (that's 67 cubic inches), is approximately 15" in diameter and 22" in length, weighs 101 lbs. and puts out **180hp!** Here are a couple of pictures of the static



display and you can find out more at www.dukeengines.com along with an Adobe Flash video of its operation. They are now in their third iteration of the engine so progress is being made; let's hope the money doesn't run out first!



To top off the month, we held our annual BBQ at my hangar and I'm sure all would agree it was a success with great food and plenty of pleasant conversation.
